

HISTORIC HUNGERFORD

The attractive and historic town of Hungerford has been described as lying at the crossroads of England. It is situated 3 miles south of the M4 (J 14). The Bear Hotel marks the gateway to the town at the junction of Charnham Street (A4) and Bridge Street (A338) which crosses the river and canal and opens out into the main part of this attractive market town.

Hungerford is 8 miles west of Newbury and 7 miles west of the A4 junction with the A34 (Oxford to Southampton Arterial Link Road). The town is also only 9 miles east of Marlborough and 12 miles south east of Swindon.

The town is surrounded by beautiful countryside and wide open spaces including Hungerford Common and the Wetlands Conservation Area. The River Dunn runs along the south boundary of the hotel and 50 meters away is the Kennet & Avon Canal.

DIRECTIONS

Exit Junction 14 on the M4 and follow signs for Hungerford (A338) for three miles until the T Junction with the A4. Turn right and continue to follow the signs to Hungerford. At the next mini roundabout take the first exit signposted Hungerford, and follow for approximately 400 yards. At the next mini roundabout go straight on and you will find the Bear Hotel car park is approximately 100 yards on the left hand side.
